Environmental Complaints

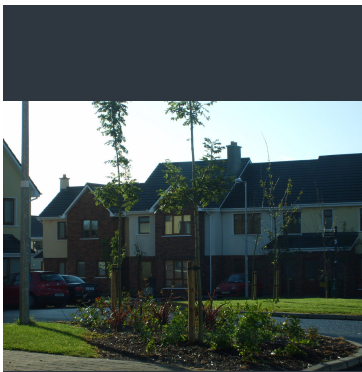
Are you experiencing water, waste, air or noise pollution?

Holiday Safety Tips

The Christmas holidays should be a magical time for everyone. Yet each year hospital emergency rooms treat thousands of people for injuries, such as falls, cuts and shocks, related to holiday lights, decorations and Christmas trees.

So with the holidays just around the corner, there are many things to consider when it comes to keeping you and your family healthy, safe and happy.

The Tree

- When purchasing an artificial tree, look for the label “Fire Resistant”
- If purchasing a live tree, check for freshness, needles should not pull off easily from the branches
- When setting up a tree at home, place it away from fireplaces and radiators
- Heated rooms dry live trees rapidly, ensure your live tree stand is filled with water

Lights

- Indoors or outdoors, always use lights that have been tested for safety by a recognised agency
- Check each set of lights for broken or cracked sockets or loose connections, and discard damaged sets
- Fasten outdoor lights securely to trees, walls etc. to support them from wind damage
- Turn off lights when you go to bed or leave the house. The lights could short out and start a fire
- Try not to use extension cords and never overload wall sockets

Candles

- Ensure candles are placed in sturdy containers, away from anything that can burn, including decorations
- Ensure candles are out of reach of small children and pets
- Always extinguish candles prior to leaving the room, going to bed or leaving home

Decorations

- Ensure breakables and decorations are placed at the top of the tree, away from pets and children
- Ensure that natural decorations such as holly berries and mistletoe are also away from young children

General

- Ensure you have working smoke alarms around your home. Test monthly and never disable
- Develop and practice a home fire escape plan
- Have a working fire extinguisher readily available and know how to use it
