Burglary Prevention Advice

When selecting a target, burglars assess how easily they can enter a house. They look for houses with weakened entry points, where the residents are careless about security and houses with few or no security devices. Burglars know that home owners can often be lax about security. It's good to know that burglars are less likely to gain entry when a house has 2 or more security devices. To help you protect your home below are some top tips:

- 1. Lock your doors and windows and turn on your alarm, sounds simple, but the figures indicate that up to 1 in 3 burglaries could have been prevented by this simple action.
- 2. When we are in our homes we should also lock doors and windows which are out of our view.
- 3. Remove obstructions to increase visibility and natural surveillance. Trim trees and shrubs. Use motion activated lighting. Make a would-be burglar visible to a neighbour or passerby.
- 4. Ask a neighbour/ friend to check your house if you are away for longer periods.
- 5. Give the impression someone is home. Leave some lights or the radio on.
- 6. Store valuables in a secure location; use a good quality safe which is secure.
- 7. Do not keep large amounts of cash at home.
